Frequently asked questions

Plan Features

1. What is PRUCare Life?

PRUCare Life is an affordable non-participating group insurance plan where Prudential Assurance Malaysia Berhad (PAMB) is the Master Policyholder of the plan. This plan offers Critical Illness (43 CIs) Benefit and Dengue Fever Benefit to the Insured Member for a period of 12 months from Commencement Date of the Insured Member's Insurance Certificate.

2. What benefit does PRUCare Life provide?

Benefits		Sum Assured
Critical Illness Benefit	In the event of the Insured Member's diagnosis of a covered Critical Illness, 100% of sum assured will be payable. Note: 10% of the sum assured subject to a maximum of RM 25,000 is payable on Angioplasty And Other Invasive Treatments For Coronary Artery Disease. The sum assured will be reduced after partial claim is made.	RM10,000 to RM200,000 Note: Insured Members may choose a Sum Assured from RM10,000 (in multiples of RM5,000), e.g. RM10,000, RM15,000, RM20,000, up to a maximum of RM200,000.
Dengue Fever Benefit	In the event of the Insured Member's diagnosis of Dengue Fever, 100% of sum assured will be payable. Note: Diagnosis needs to be done by a qualified doctor, accompanied by a confirmatory test result. Dengue Fever Benefit is payable once.	RM500

3. Who is eligible to purchase PRUCare Life?

You may purchase this plan if you are a member of Employees Provident Fund ("EPF") and between age next birthday of 19 and 60, subject to terms and conditions by EPF.

4. How do I sign up?

Sign-in to EPF i-Akaun Portal > go to i-Lindung tab > select **PRUCare Life** > complete details at PAMB portal > complete authorisation for deduction from EPF Account via EPF i-Akaun Transfer Gateway.

5. How do I find out more about the features and benefits of PRUCare Life?

6. Is there a waiting period applicable for PRUCare Life?

8. Can I buy PRUCare Life from my Prudential agent?

No, this is an online self-enrolled plan offered through EPF i-Akaun Portal only.

Premium and Charges

9. How much premium do I need to pay?

Kindly refer to the Product Disclosure Sheet for the premium. The premium payable is subject to the Insured Member's entry age and Sum Assured chosen.

10. How can I pay the premium for the plan?

You may pay the premium for the plan via withdrawal from your Employees Provident Fund (EPF) Account.

11. Is Sales and Services Tax (SST) chargeable for PRUCare Life?

SST is not chargeable for **PRUCare Life**.

12. Are there any additional fees and charges for this plan?

There are no additional fees and charges other than the premium indicated in the Product Disclosure Sheet.

13. Can I claim for tax relief on the premium paid for this plan?

Yes, 100% of the premium paid for this plan may qualify you for personal income tax relief under Medical Insurance category, subject to the terms and conditions of the Inland Revenue Board of Malaysia.

Note: Please keep a copy of the receipt (or any other document as required), obtainable from printing the acknowledgement slip after successful payment, for tax relief purposes.

Underwriting

14. Do I need to undergo any medical, health or financial assessments to buy PRUCare Life?

You need not undergo any medical or health assessments to buy **PRUCare Life**. However, Anti-Money Laundering (AML) assessment will apply and will be conducted by PAMB.

15. What happens if I wrongly / mistakenly declare wrong information?

When answering any question asked by us, you must disclose all relevant facts correctly. We reserve the right to verify the information and declarations provided by you and may avoid your coverage if incorrect information is provided. Kindly refer to the Master Policy or Insurance Certificate for more details on Anti-Money Laundering (AML), Anti-Terrorism Financing and Proceeds of Unlawful Activities.

16. Can I purchase multiple PRUCare Life Insurance Certificates?

Yes, you may buy multiple **PRUCare Life Insurance Certificates**, up to a maximum Sum Assured of RM200,000 per life for Critical Illness Benefit, aggregated with your existing **PRUCare Life Insurance Certificates** (if any). However, the maximum Sum Assured payable for Dengue Fever Benefit is RM500, payable once per Insured Member.

Policy Servicing

17. After I have purchased my Insurance Certificate, who may I contact for servicing?

You may perform self-servicing such as change of contact details and cancellation of coverage in '**PRUServices**' in the Pulse by Prudential mobile application. Please refer to Questions 19 and 20 for more details.

18. How do I receive my Insurance Certificate after purchase?

Once your sign-up has been successful, you will receive an email confirmation with your Insurance Certificate. The Insurance Certificate can also be viewed in EPF i-Akaun Portal. Alternatively, you may download the Pulse by Prudential mobile application (via App Store or Google Play) to view your Insurance Certificate in '**PRUServices**'.



19. How can I change my contact details?

You may change and update the address and contact details via 'Update Contact Details' in 'PRUServices' in the Pulse by Prudential mobile application.

20. Can I cancel my Insurance Certificate after purchasing it?

You may choose to cancel your Insurance Certificate in 'PRUServices' in the Pulse by Prudential mobile application during the Free Look Period for a full refund.

You may also surrender your Insurance Certificate after the Free Look Period. If you do so, your coverage will terminate upon payment of surrender value. We will pay the surrender value of the Insurance Certificate to you as a percentage of premiums paid, as shown in the Product Disclosure Sheet. If you are aged below 55 (attained age based on your EPF account), you will receive this refund via your EPF Account. If you are aged 55 and above (attained age based on your EPF account) or if your EPF Account is inactive, the refund will be credited to your bank account, according to the bank details which you provide to us.

21. What is Free Look Period?

You may cancel your Insurance Certificate in 'PRUServices' in the Pulse by Prudential mobile application within 15 days after the Insurance Certificate has been delivered to you. We will refund to you the premiums that you have paid. If you are aged below 55 (attained age based on your EPF account), you will receive this refund via your EPF Account. If you are aged 55 and above (attained age based on your EPF account) or if your EPF Account is inactive, the refund will be credited to your bank account, according to the bank details which you provide to us.

Nomination (Not Applicable to PRUCare Life due to No Death Benefit is Offered)

22. Why is it important to nominate a beneficiary?

Claims

25. How do I submit claims?

For a claim on Critical Illness or Dengue Fever Benefit:

You may also register a claim via the 'Register Claim' in 'PRUServices' in the Pulse by Prudential mobile application along with the supporting documents. Alternatively, you may submit the completed Claim form(s) along with the supporting documents to the nearest Prudential branch.

26. What are the documents required when submitting a claim?

For a claim on Critical Illness Benefit:

You are required to submit the following via Pulse by Prudential mobile application:

- 1) Front and back of NRIC image;
- 2) Portrait or Selfie image holding ID/NRIC verification;
- 3) Copy of Critical Illness Claim (Doctor's Statement for critical illness) - completed and signed by doctor who treated the Insured Member;
- 4) Laboratory Report: Histopathology Examination Report, Biopsy, MRI, scan and investigation results (where applicable)

For a claim on Dengue Fever Benefit:

For submission via Pulse by Prudential mobile application, claimant is required to submit the following:

- 1) Front and back of NRIC image;
- 2) Portrait or Selfie image holding ID/NRIC verification;
- 3) Infectious Disease Benefit Claim – Doctor's Statement (downloadable from 'My Claim' page in the Pulse by



- Prudential mobile application); and
- 4) Confirmatory Test Result - completed and signed by doctor who treated the Insured Member.

Prudential Assurance Malaysia Berhad (PAMB) reserves the right to request for other relevant supporting documents, information or to view the original of the copied documents whenever necessary.

27. How long will it take to process the claim?

Upon receiving the complete documents, the claim payment will be processed within 14 working days.

Termination

28. Under what circumstances will my insurance coverage terminate?

Your insurance certificate terminates automatically:

- a) when the Insured Member dies;
- b) upon payment of Surrender Value under the Insured Member's Insurance Certificate;
- c) when there is no amount payable for any benefits under the Insured Member's Insurance Certificate;
- d) when the insurance coverage of the Insured Member is cancelled, voided or terminated; or
- e) on the last day of the Coverage Period of the Insured Member's Insurance Certificate;

whichever happens first.

29. Will my Insurance Certificate terminate after I have submitted a claim?

Your Insurance Certificate will terminate only if claims for both Critical Illness and Dengue Fever benefits have been made.

Coverage for Critical Illness Benefit will cease if the benefit amount stated in your insurance certificate has been fully paid out.

Coverage for Dengue Benefit will cease if the benefit amount stated in your insurance certificate has been fully paid out.

30. What should I do if I wish to continue my coverage under PRUCare Life upon expiry of my Insurance Certificate?

You may choose to purchase another PRUCare Life plan with the underwriting and waiting period (if any) waived, subject to the following conditions:

- 1) You are buying the same plan, with the same benefits as well as Sum Assured as existing Insurance Certificate upon repurchase;
- 2) You pay for the premium based on your age next birthday at the point of repurchase; and
- 3) No Critical Illness claims are paid under the existing Insurance Certificate.

If you are eligible for such waivers, we will reach out to you prior to the expiry of your existing Insurance Certificate with more details on the process. Upon successful repurchase, an endorsement slip will be issued to you as confirmation.

31. How can I provide my feedback on Pulse by Prudential mobile application?
